Regarding: California Public Records Request and information promised  
to the employees by the District in 1998

Dear Eddie:

① I've been reading and re-reading the attached 6/3/1998 District Memo from John Stroh to Kay DeGeest, SJPEA Representative. Of particular note to me today is the second item mentioned: The District contracting with a private firm to test water from representative types of mosquito breeding sources (i.e., agricultural, industrial, and municipal wastewater facilities, county drains and ditches, etc.). The tests were to include general microbiological testing, including evaluation of bacterial pathogens, parasites, and human viruses. Copies of lab reports were to be provided to employees as they became available. The language in the Memo was pretty clear and specific, as you can read for yourself.

Now I realize that this memo is from mid-1998, but as I believe that I have suffered multiple exposures while working for the District, these lab reports would be important to have. Please forward to me the 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011 reports. I am requesting them on two basis: they were guaranteed in the memo from former-manager Stroh and under the California Public Records Law. Ten business days should be sufficient time for your staff to mail these (at least) annual lab reports to me.

As you've continually asked me about my retirement application, I thought that I'd give you an update. As of today, my retirement has been approved. That news, coupled with my familial obligations, has led me to renew my proposal to you and the District to settle all of my claims in one final, lump-sum, tax-free amount. That figure, through 5 pm on May 20<sup>th</sup>, 2014, is now \$400,000. I picked that date and time to allow the Board to take up this proposed settlement offer. This offer will become null and void one minute after that deadline.

Failing to reach a settlement, we will continue with this lengthy discovery process and further prepare for litigation. My contact information remains correct as it appears at the top of this letter.

5) Copies of any U.S. OSHA reports or documents showing whether or not the Mosquito District had Injury, Illness and Prevention Programs in place, and documentation of the training of their employees on an annual basis, for the same time period in item #4.

Should any information be denied, please provide an explanation. If you determine that some, but not all, of the information is exempt from disclosure and that you intend to withhold it, I ask that you redact it for the time being and make the rest of the requested information available.
