My desire not to return to see Dr. Eck is due to his lack of interest of what I was communicating to him.

Dr. Eck twisted and torqued my right leg into many angles. He also stuck his finger into my laceration.

Dr. Eck stated there was nothing he could do for me, but yet rescheduled a follow up appointment.

Prior to leaving I inquired if there were any other physicians to see on my return appointment, when I was told no, I informed the staff as a whole and I did not care for the Dr. I was informed not too many people do care for him.

I then informed the staff I did not desire to return and I was informed I had to tell you.

After leaving the office I was in severe pain along the joint line of my knee. I have a severe burning sensation where the laceration joined my post op incision. Also my knee is now swollen.

I was instructed to ice every 10-20 minutes which is an unreasonable request during work hours.

I hope this is specific and brief enough.
