I spoke with Emily this morning after receiving your response last night. Emily informed me you never informed her to send the documents to me. I have financial obligations that I am responsible for. I have been waiting 8 days for the documents from UNUM to arrive. When Emily and I spoke she informed me that it is the initiative of the employee to request the forms. UNUM is notorious for slow processing, which means I am going to be in financial dire.

As far as AIMS is concerned it has been 55 days since my injury. Not a scratch as both you and Eddie have defined it, a open wound 18 cm in length with a external bruise from my ankle to my thigh. If you would have reported the injury to AIMS the day I filed the DWC form I would not be in in this situation right now. Instead you paid out of the Districts funds and

I will have Emily Nicholas forward you information on UNUM for any short- and long-term disability benefits that you may be eligible for. Your workers compensation claim is pending review by the claims administrator, and until we receive notice that this claim is accepted, we cannot consider implementation of any salary continuation benefits. Until such time as we receive word from the claims administrator, your absence from work will charged to your accrued leave. I will continue to evaluate the work needs of the district as they relate to the work restrictions provided by Dr. Murata.
