Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, I am hereby requesting to be made open to the public copies of the following documents:

- 1) Purchase orders and application records from the San Joaquin County Mosquito & Vector Control District (Mosquito District) for the use, storage, and /or application of any and all aquaculture drugs, chemicals, or biologics, including but not limited to pesticides and herbicides from January 1, 2003-June 25, 2015, for the property listed above. (The Mosquito District is a subsidiary applicant to the City of Lodi, but is itself a concentrated aquatic animal production facility).
- 2) Copies of the Mosquito District's NPDES permit applications, testing results, monitoring and compliance reports as submitted to the U.S. EPA during the time period referenced above and for the property listed above.
- 3) Permits and/or approvals from the City of Lodi for the construction of the 13 unlined fish rearing ponds located at the property of 12751 Thornton Road, Lodi, CA 95242.
- 4) Copies of any and all U.S. OSHA or Cal-OSHA documented work related injuries reported by the Mosquito District or its employees from the time the ponds in item #3 were built to June 25, 2015, including my own personal injury of 1/21/2005. (To date, I

have been refused copies of my medical records for this work related injury despite numerous attempts to conquer the worker's compensation bureaucracy at the state level and the Mosquito District).

5) Copies of any U.S. OSHA reports or documents showing whether or not the Mosquito District had Injury, Illness and Prevention Programs in place, and documentation of the training of their employees on an annual basis, for the same time period in item #4.

Should any information be denied, please provide an explanation. If you determine that some, but not all, of the information is exempt from disclosure and that you intend to withhold it, I ask that you redact it for the time being and make the rest of the requested information available.
