WORK STATUS: This patient has been instructed to Remain off work until Return to modified work with the following limitations and restrictions: **No squatting or climbing. Intermittent standing and walking.** Return to full duty with no limitations or restrictions.Continue with: Modified Work Full Duty**Date of Exam: October 06, 2009****Part of Body: Right Knee**

Subjective complaints: Tiffany believes that she re-tore her lateral meniscus. She has had intermittent swelling. She showed me several pictures on her phone showing swelling over the lateral joint line. She believes that she possibly could have re-torn her meniscus after her second MRI when she went back to work which requires frequent walking as well as climbing and jumping off of fences perhaps as high as 6 feet.

Objective findings: She is tender along the lateral joint line, with good range of motion and no effusion. Slight limp.

Assessment: Rule out recurrent lateral meniscus tear. Even though she had an MRI following her surgical treatment and did go back to work, again, Tiffany feels that she re-tore her meniscus. She did this with normal activities at work such as jumping fences 6 feet high.

Plan: An MRI will be ordered of the right knee. Follow-up in the office after the above study. In the meantime, continue modified work with no squatting or climbing, walking and standing intermittent.
