Date of Exam: December 11, 2009 Part of Body: Right Knee

Subjective: Tiffany continues to have mostly anterior pain about the knee, but also some lateral joint discomfort. Also, she notes swelling.

Objective: She has a mild antalgic gait pattern, good range of motion of the knee. Most of her tenderness is over the patellofemoral joint, but she also has tenderness over the lateral joint line. She does have a small palpable meniscal cyst.

I reviewed the MRI which was performed at Kaiser Permanente, and I believe there is a tear of the lateral meniscus, which is mostly a horizontal cleavage tear, with a meniscal cyst.

ASSESSMENT: Recurrent lateral meniscus tear with meniscal cyst. The patient is very symptomatic. Even though Tiffany's pain is not completely localized, she continues to have tenderness along the lateral joint line with a painful meniscal cyst. I believe she would benefit from repeat arthroscopic surgery and excision of the meniscal cyst. She would like to proceed with surgical treatment. Follow-up in the office pm. I recommended modified work. I agree with the radiology report received from Kaiser Permanente in regards to the lateral meniscus tear with the perimeniscal cyst. The remaining MRI, including the medial compartment, appears normal.
