I went from the Dean's List to a C average. This quarter I am taking 9 units instead of 16. Hopefully I can bring my GPA back up. I just wanted to graduate and get out of that place

ASAP. The sad thing is I know my job well, for the time I have been there. If I was just given the tools needed and a supervisor with realistic expectation, I could succeed and leaving would not be necessary. Most days it is even a fun job. A requirement for my Deviant Behavior class was to read One Flew over The Cuckoo's Nest, the irony of Mrs. Ratchet and my manager were uncanny.

My mom and grandma are doing better. My grandma is at a rehab facility. The goal is to get grandma well enough to go home so she can die in the comfort of her own home. I wanted to give you an overview of how things are going, but I really want to know should I still be corresponding with the Grand Jury? Or is the ingestion over?

I think maybe a little rule book should come along with the do's and don't of how to behave during a Grand Jury investigation along with an idea of how the process works, including time lines. Waiting seems to be a challenge, especially when you don't even know what your waiting for.
