He did not have his lab work done after his last visit; however, he also stopped taking the Naprosyn about two months ago. He apparently got the flu and ran out of medications an never called for a refill. He has complaints of aching of the left knee which tends to be worse with cold weather.

On examination, weight was 330 lb; he was initially standing improperly on the scale and that makes his last weight questionable (283 lb).
